Lesson 10 Vocabulary List

<u>cable</u>: *n*. 1. A thick steel rope made of strands of wire twisted together. (Example: A <u>cable</u> with a large hook on the end dangled from the top of the crane.)

2. A bundle of wires covered by rubber or plastic along which an electric current can pass. (*Example: The electric company will run an underground <u>cable</u> from this station to Quincy to provide extra power when it is needed.)*

<u>cathedral</u>: *n*. A large and important church. (*Example: The National <u>Cathedral</u> in Washington, D.C. is the sixth largest in the world.*)

<u>convey</u>: v. 1. To carry or move from one place to another. (*Example: A wagon with high sides conveyed the cut sugar-cane to the mill.*)

2. To make an idea or feeling known. (*Example: As the curtain closed, the crowd clapped loudly to <u>convey</u> how much they had enjoyed the play.)*

<u>device</u>: *n*. Something made or invented for a particular use. (Example: When you need a <u>device</u> for lifting heavy weights without a great deal of effort, a lever will work best.)

freight: *n*. Goods carried from place to place, as by plane, boat, truck, or train. (*Example: The trains passing through this station carry <u>freight from the middle of the country to the East Coast.</u>)*

landmark: *n*. 1. A building or natural feature that is easy to see and can be used as a guide. (*Example: The Gateway Arch is a well-known landmark in St. Louis, Missouri.*)

2. An important event. (*Example: The discovery that certain bacteria can cause disease was a <u>landmark</u> in the history of medicine.)*

<u>method</u>: *n*. A way of doing something. (*Example: Tara's <u>method</u> for bringing her cat inside is to shake the container with treats.*)

<u>**rod**</u>: *n*. A thin, straight piece of wood, metal, or other material. (Example: The shower curtain hung from a metal <u>rod</u>.)

<u>shaft</u>: *n*. 1. A long open tunnel that runs straight up and down. (Example: The coal miners traveled for five minutes to reach the bottom of the mine <u>shaft</u>.)

2. A bar that connects with other moving parts of a machine. (*Example: The drive shaft sends power from the car engine to the wheels.*)

3. The long, narrow part of an arrow or other object. (*Example: Felix made sure the <u>shafts</u> of his arrows were in a straight line.*)

<u>structure</u>: *n*. Something that is build, as a building or bridge. (*Example: From the road, it was easy to see that the largest <u>structure</u> in town was the hundred-food water tower.)*
