Lesson 13 Vocabulary List

<u>calendar:</u> *n*. A chart or diagram showing the days, weeks, and months of the year in order. (*Example: on the wall <u>calendar</u> in the kitchen, Jodie circled the day of the picnic in red.*)

<u>carnival</u>: n. A fair or show with food stalls, parades, rides, and other ways to have fun. (Example: The police are directing traffic away from Center Street where the <u>carnival</u> is set up and ready to begin.)

<u>experience</u>: *n*. 1. Knowledge or skill that comes from having done certain things. (Example: Panthea had <u>experience</u> caring for plants and offered to take care of Mrs. Levy's garden.)

- 2. Something that happens to a person; an event in one's life. (Example: Jubilee said that taking part in the Olympics was an <u>experience</u> she would never forget.)
- v. To have happen to; to go through something. (Example: Marcelo <u>experienced</u> only a tiny pain when the nurse stuck the needle in his arm.)

govern: v. To be in charge of; to control or rule. (Example: Most people in the city like the way the mayor governs it.)

gulf: n. 1. A large area of a sea or ocean that is partly enclosed by land. (Example: The <u>Gulf</u> of Mexico is bordered to the north and south by the United States and to the west and south by Mexico.)

- 2. A great distance between. (Example: After their argument, Sharin felt that a gulf had opened between her and her friend.)
- <u>haste</u>: n. Speed in acting or moving. (Example: Roosevelt left for school in such <u>haste</u> that he forgot his backpack.)
- <u>hasty</u>: adj. Done or made quickly without careful thought. (Example: When the rain started falling heavily, the crowd at the outdoor concert made a <u>hasty</u> dash to their cars.)
- **nation**: *n*. 1. A place with borders and its own leaders; a single country. (*Example: Angola became a nation in 1975, after Portugal gave up its control.*)
- 2. The people of a single country. (Example: The Prime Minister of Canada will speak to the <u>nation</u> at nine o'clock this evening.)
- <u>national</u>: adj. Of or belonging to the people of a single country. (Example: Labor Day, which comes on the first Monday or September, is a <u>national</u> holiday in the United States.)
- **<u>scatter</u>**: v. 1. To throw here and there; to spread about. (*Example: My cousin from the city likes to <u>scatter</u> the feed for the chickens.*)
- 2. To move quickly in different directions. (Example: When Carlos covered his eyes and started counting slowly to thirty, the rest of the children <u>scattered</u> to the best hiding places they could find.)
- **surrender**: v. To give in or give up; to accept defeat. (Example: The soldiers raised a white flag over the fort to stop the shooting, and then they <u>surrendered</u>.)
- <u>thrill</u>: n. A feeling of joy or excitement. (Example: At the museum, my biggest <u>thrill</u> was seeing the skeleton of Sue, the largest and most complete dinosaur of this kind yet discovered.)
- v. To feel or cause to feel joy or excitement. (Example: Maggie was thrilled when Muhammad Ali shook her hand, after his talk at the school.)
