contain: v. To hold; to have within itself. (Example: A drop of pond water contains thousands of tiny living creatures.)

<u>container:</u> n. A jar, box, or other object used for holding something. (Example: Martina and Sam loved visiting the bead shop where small square <u>containers</u> held beads of many different colors, sizes, and shapes.)

<u>digest</u>: v. To change food after it has been eaten into simpler forms that the body can use. (*Example: Because Janine cannot <u>digest</u> milk, her parents give her soy drinks*.)

<u>finicky</u>: adj. Hard to please; fussy. (Example: Adriana knew her parents would think she was being <u>finicky</u>, but she was just not hungry.)

- <u>habit</u>: n. 1. Something that a person does so often that it is done without thinking. (*Example: Katie's habit of saying "you know" after every sentence is annoying.*)
- 2. A special kind of clothing worn by certain groups. (*Example: A very important part of a riding habit is the hard helmet to protect the head in case of a fall.*)

<u>hinge</u>: n. A joint on a lid or a door that allows it to swing open or shut. (Example: Roger oiled the steel <u>hinges</u> on our front gate from time to time so they would not rust.)

- <u>marsh</u>: *n*. A low-lying area, often covered with tall grasses, where the ground is soft and wet. (*Example: The marshes near Long Island Sound provide a home for many snails, crabs, and minnows.*)
- <u>marshy</u>: adj. Soft and moist underfoot. (Example: Reeds and cattails grow in the <u>marshy</u> area near the lake.)
- <u>nursery</u>: *n*. 1. A room or other place set aside for the use of babies and small children. (*Example: On our visit to the hospital, we stopped by the nursery to take a look at our new cousin.)*
- 2. A place where plants are grown for sale. (Example: On Saturday, Uncle Karl and Aunt Ruby went to the <u>nursery</u> to choose two locust trees to plant in front of their house.)
- <u>rely</u>: v. To count on; to look to for support. (Example: When they asked Diane if they could rely on her to deliver the secret message to the right person, she said, "Of course!")
- <u>reliable</u>: adj. Trustworthy; not likely to fail. (Example: Until he could repair the brakes, Dad said our car was not <u>reliable</u> for a trip from Houston to Minneapolis.)
- **spine**: n. 1. The backbone. (Example: The <u>spine</u> protects the nerves that run from the brain to every part of the body.)
- 2. A thin, sharp, stiff part that sticks out on certain plants and animals. (*Example: The one-inch long spines on a prickly pear cactus have been used to make toothpicks and needles.*)
- <u>thrive</u>: v. To do well; to grow strong and healthy. (Example: Lavender plants thrive in sunny spots without too much water.)
